

CODE OF CONDUCT

STUDENT PERFORMANCE:

All students enrolling in the U of N are expected to be committed Christians who aim to further glorify God in their lives. As a result, faculty and staff have high expectations for each student. The U of N modular education system demands concentrated study and continuous diligence, because the academic content of each course or school is equivalent to several secular university courses. Since the expectations and demands are high, student performance is monitored carefully.

The U of N believes that the development of Christian character is an integral part of our training and a central ongoing goal of the U of N. Consequently, we expect that the conduct of U of N students will be in keeping with Biblical standards. Any verified moral violation (including but not limited to sexual immorality, lying, dishonesty, theft, substance abuse, physical abuse or sexual abuse) will be considered grounds for disciplinary action.

1. Any student receiving a grade of "U" for the DTS/CDTS (DSP 211/212) will not be able to continue in the university until the course is repeated satisfactorily, resulting in an "S" grade for the course.
2. Any student who cheats or plagiarizes may be given an immediate failing grade in a course and thus be dismissed from the U of N.

Definitions:

Cheating: breaking rules to gain advantage; to break the rules in a game, examination, or contest, in an attempt to gain an unfair advantage.

Plagiarism: stealing somebody's work or idea; copying what somebody else has written or taking somebody else's idea and trying to pass it off as original. (Encarta World English Dictionary).
